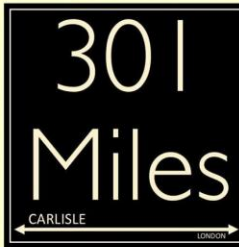
Tickets will be ON SALE from The Kings Head only.

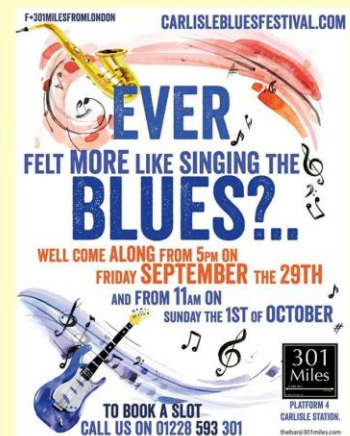
